EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulting or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of The Brave Horse Show Series (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

USEF Waiver

Everyone, including parents, grooms, guests, etc. must sign a USEF Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement, this can be done on HorseShowing.com at the time you do your entries. Forms are available at www.horseshowing.com or www.usef.org.

Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Statement as to Federation Fee

(GR407.1-3) For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$23 Federation Fee will be collected (\$15 shall be an Equine Drugs & Medication Fee to provide for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs).

Exception: Horses entered in classes exempted from the Equine Drugs and Medication fee are also exempt from the balance of the Federation fee.

Health Requirements

All horses must have a valid proof of a negative equine infectious anemia test within the past 12 months. (Coggins test). A 30-day certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Pennsylvania.

1. At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

THIS WILL BE A CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THIS SHOW OR SHOW GROUNDS.

Safe Sport Statement

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirements to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

As of Jan 1, 2019 every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) with a Competing Membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training. You will do this when logged into your USEF account, preferably when you renew your membership. Failure to complete the safe sport training will disqualify you from competing in any capacity until it is completed. Junior riders that have reached their 18th Birthday must complete the Safe Sport.

Rules & Regulations

- HORSE SHOW MANAGEMENT:** Horse Show Management reserves the right in itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules & Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any changes management deems is in the best interest of the show and its exhibitors. Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed, and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.
- OFFICE/ADMINISTRATION FEE:** Each horse will pay a \$100.00 Administration Fee. All horses occupying a stall, whether showing or not are required to pay an administration fee.
- FEED/BEDDING:** Feed and bedding will be available at the show. All pre-orders must be submitted 7 days prior to the start of the show. Shavings are available for \$12.00 per bag. Hay is available for \$18.00 per bale.
- STALING:** Stalls MUST be pre-paid in order for entry to be accepted. Stalls are 10 x 10. Stalls are \$400.00 and must be prepaid or reserved with a valid credit card. Stalls will be available to move in to at 8:00 am on August 13, 2024 and must be vacated by 9:00 am on August 19, 2024. For stall reservations, entry blanks must be completed and submitted with payment. Stall requests must be finalized 14 days before the first day of the show. No stalls will be reserved without pre-payment. No refunds after the closing date.
- SHIP-IN FEE:** Horses that have not purchased a stall will be subject to a \$75.00 Ship-in Fee. Horses may not "split" stalls, meaning each individual horse will be required to pay for either a stall or ship-in fee.
- NON-SHOWING HORSES/SCRATCH FEE:** All non-showing horses must have completed and signed an entry blank. Non-showing horses or horses that scratch from competition after the closing date for entries will pay a \$150.00 non-showing/scratch fee, along with the Office/Administration Fee (\$100.00).
- HORSE SHOW OFFICE:** The office will open 1 hour prior to the start of the show each day and close at 4:00 PM or 30 minutes after the last class finishes, whichever comes first. Adds for the following day must be completed before the office closes.
- RETURNED CHECKS:** A processing fee of 10% or \$30.00 minimum will be assessed for all non-negotiable checks. A 3% convenience fee will be charged for credit card transactions.
- PRIZE MONEY:** An IRS/W9 needs to be completed showing the proper prize money recipient and their SS or FED ID#. Care must be taken to be sure the information matches that of the IRS. Prize money will be deducted from your account upon closeout in the office provided you have filled out the required IRS/W9. Balances will be paid in the form of a check at the show or may be mailed to the named recipient on the W9 within 30 days after the conclusion of the show. The IRS W9 form is available in the show office. Any credit due will be mailed within 30 days following each show. No prize money will be mailed unless the owner's (or other designated payee's) social security number and complete address are listed on the entry blank.
- CLOSING DATES:** Entries close **AUGUST 9, 2024 at 5:00 PM EST**. Stall counts must be finalized 14 days before the show, stalls must be paid in full in order to be reserved. After the closing date, stalls are not refundable for any reason. Entries received after AUGUST 9, 2024 will incur a \$50.00 Late Entry Fee. Horses that scratch after the closing date will incur the \$150.00 Scratch Fee. If you are mailing an entry, it must be received no later than 7 days before the show to avoid a late fee and online entries must be submitted by 5:00 pm, Monday prior to the show. Faxed entries WILL NOT be accepted. There is no penalty for adding classes or substituting horses (same owner/rider) at the show. Please Mail Entries and Stall Checks payable to Partridge Run LLC. Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of the Rules & Regulations governing the

Horse Show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross-entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee and class placing.

- 11. RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter):** Entries that show in a class that was not properly entered either online, by inclusion on your original entry, or a properly filled out add slip PRIOR to the class involved will be charged a \$15 RDNE Fee. This charge will show on your statement as "entered off judge's card". All class adds must be completed by 4:00 P.M. the day before the class in question to assure acceptance.
- 12. TICKETED SCHOOLING:** Ticketed schooling will be offered at Management's discretion. Ticketed schooling is \$25/Horse/Day.
- 13. ADDING CLASSES:** Same day adds may not be allowed, always enter the day before the classes are scheduled.
- 14. SCRATCHING CLASSES:** This MUST BE DONE IN THE SHOW OFFICE or your horseshowsonline.com account, or an official add/scratch slip. Full credit will only be given for any classes scratched before the start of the class. Informing the starter that you do not intend to participate does not constitute as officially scratching the class and the exhibitor or a representative is still required to inform the horse show office. Changes not made in the horse show office will not be refunded.
- 15. SCHOOLING:** Schooling in the show rings without permission is prohibited at all times. There will be a \$100 fine for anyone caught in the rings before or after the show if rings have been closed. The rings will only be available for hacking in the mornings. The number of horses in the ring at one time may be limited for safety. No lunging permitted in any of the show rings at anytime.
- 16. CREDENTIALS:** USEF / USHJA Membership, Amateur and Measurement Cards. This show will be electronically verified with the USEF provided you have submitted a COMPLETE entry blank, including all required numbers and signatures, you will not be required to show us your membership cards, measurement cards, or recording cards. We WILL NOT look up your numbers for you. If you have recently applied online, you will be given an instant number so include it on your entry. Please do not mail Memberships to USEF, they will not be electronically verifiable for weeks and we will be required to charge you non-member fees. Incomplete entry forms will be charged a fee of \$25 (considered late entry) and will be required to show proof of membership, etc. before your number is released.
No numbers will be released until proper credentials, a valid form of payment and all signatures of owner, rider or handler and trainer are in order. All Pony or Junior Hunters who do not possess a current measurement card will be measured at a time and place to be announced. All horses competing in US Equestrian Federation recognized competitions (except those activities enumerated in GR901.9) must be properly identified and must obtain a USHJA horse identification number. USHJA Horse Registration - \$75.00. Any change of horse's name and/or ownership must be recorded with the Federation.
Mandatory Microchipping went into effect on December 1, 2018. You will not be allowed to COMPETE on any horse that has not been micro-chipped. Microchips must be properly recorded with USHJA.
- 17. SHOW AND SCHOOLING AREAS:** New Holland Arena 120 x 240; New Holland Schooling Area 80 x 150; Equine Arena 150 x 250; Equine Schooling Area 150 x 200; Outside Schooling/Lunging Area 120 x 220. Indoor arenas are equipped with DJL Synthetic Blend Footing. Outdoor Arena is equipped with Sand/Stone Dust footing.
- 18. HUNTER COURSES:** Courses will consist of at least eight fences with changes of direction. Fences will simulate obstacles found in the hunt field, such as brush, post and rails, walls, in and out, gates, etc. No bank or water jumps. Course diagrams will be posted no later than 30 minutes before the class. In some cases, the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a dotted line. Under Saddle classes to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales permitted. In High Performance, A/O and Junior classes, entries may be asked to hand gallop collectively one way of the ring, at the Judge's discretion. No more than eight shall be asked to hand gallop at one time. Minimum entry requirements: Management reserves the right to combine Sections with less than six entries. No split Section will be held with less than three entries. Handy Hunters Courses and jumps to simulate those found in trappy hunt country, and may include natural obstacles, a trot fence and a fence to lead over.
- 19. POLING:** Manual poling and use of bamboo offsets are prohibited at all times while on the show grounds. Exhibitors found in violation will forfeit all entry fees for that showing day or day afterwards and may be excluded from showing for 24 hours upon any incident recorded with Management and the USEF Steward.
- 20. TIME ALLOWED:** The jumper time allowed is based on a minimum of 382 yards per minute for all sections.
- 21. JUMPING ORDER:** A rotating jumping order will be established with the starter. Exhibitors must check in with the Starter to establish an order of go. There will be a posted order for all jumper classics and medal classes. Riders and/or trainers who have conflicts due to multiple entries in a class must see the starter so that necessary adjustments can be made. In classes where horses compete collectively, a warning is issued and the in-gate must be closed two minutes after the first horse enters the ring. Judging will commence when the gate is closed or at the end of the two-minute call.
- 22. CHAMPION & RESERVE CHAMPION AWARDS:** Ribbons awarded to 8th place in all classes. A Champion and Reserve champion for each eligible hunter division is to be determined after the last class for each division, consisting of at least three over fences and one under saddle. The determination is to be done in a manner consistent with current USEF specifications. The top four horses or ponies from those receiving points over fences also receive any points from the undersaddle class. The top two are then the show Champion and Reserve Champion. Points are assigned in this manner: 1st=10, 2nd=6, 3rd=4, 4th=2, 5th=1, 6th=½. In the event of a tie the horse with the most points over fences will be the Champion. A Jumper Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded after the last class for each section that offers 3 or more classes.

- 23. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR:** ALL EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR ASTM APPROVED HEADGEAR AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED. It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. While competing in a jumping class, if a rider's chin strap becomes unfastened, the rider may stop, re-fasten the chin strap and continue his/her round without penalty or elimination. A judge may, but is not required, to stop a rider and ask them to refasten a chin strap which has become unfastened, again without penalty to the rider.
- 24. REFUNDS:** Entries cancelled prior to the closing date will be refunded in full. Stalls and processing fees are not refundable for any reason after the closing date of entries. All entry scratches must be submitted in writing. All accounts become final after the close of the show, changes will not be considered after this date, no exceptions. Please look over your statement carefully before checking out. If the show must be stopped due to a storm, accident or other emergency, the show management has the right to deny a refund of any or all fees.
- 25. DOGS:** Dog owners failing to comply with this rule must/will be issued a Yellow warning card by the steward or any competition official. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds at any time and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Immediately following the receipt by the Federation of a third Yellow Warning Card indicating that a competitor, spectator, or participant has been issued three (3) Yellow Warning Cards within a (16) month period the Executive Director shall either levy a fine ranging from \$500 to \$1000 or a formal Charge pursuant to this Rule and GR604 alleging that the rules have been violated on all or any one of said three occasions pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Rules.
- 26. MEDICAL WASTE:** In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste container will be provided in the stable area. Failure to use them will result in a \$100 fine per needle found. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of medical waste. Needles are not to be mixed with manure or trash and shall be disposed of in medical waste containers. Sharps containers will be available and accessible in accordance with GR1210.4.
- 27. AIR VESTS:** Air vests are allowed (and encouraged) in all disciplines. For hunter and equitation classes, judges are instructed to not deduct points for the use of an air vest. Please understand the show will not be delayed in order to reset the air vest. Riders who choose to wear air vests are therefore strongly encouraged to have spare equipment (air canisters, tethers, and entire vest) ringside so that the vests that have been inflated can quickly be returned to operation. Air vests are permitted without a show coat ONLY if being worn with a color matched, long sleeve, collared shirt.
- 28. EARBUDS:** Earbuds or earphones are prohibited in any areas designated for schooling and exercising including lunging areas.
- 29. JUMPER SPECIFICATIONS:** All jumper classes are held in accordance with USHJA Zone 2 Specifications. <https://www.ushja.org/zones-affiliates/zone-2/specifications>
- 30. HUNTER SPECIFICATIONS:** All hunter classes are held in accordance with USHJA Zone 2 Specifications. <https://www.ushja.org/zones-affiliates/zone-2/specifications>
- 31. USHJA HUNTERS:** A horse and/or rider may only compete in one (1) section of the height. No more than two (2) sections may be judged at the same time. Contiguous height sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in a class. Heights must be clearly marked.
USHJA HUNTER 2'6"/2'9"/3'0": Combinations are permitted. To be shown over a course of eight (8) fences.
USHJA HUNTER 2'0"/2'3": Oxers are options, combinations are not permitted. To be shown over a course of eight (8) fences.
- 32. SPLITTING/COMBINING:** IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING SPLITTING/COMBINING & ADD/SCRATCH POLICY IN ALL "A" RATED HUNTER SECTIONS - Should entries warrant, all "A" rated hunter sections will be split or combined following USEF rules and will be done so at the close of the horse show office on the evening preceding the first class in each section, therefore entries MUST be completed for "A" rated hunter divisions accordingly to be considered. Any post-adds received and accepted after this time will not be considered in respect to the splitting/combining numbers. There will be no exceptions to this policy. Same day scratches and/or "no-shows" at the gate in all "A" rated hunter sections will forfeit their entry fee unless a Certificate from the Official Show Veterinarian vet scratch for the show is received by the official show secretary prior to the First class of the section in question. Should same day scratches or no-shows result in insufficient entries to keep sections split, sections will be combined.

NON-USEF RATED CLASSES - No USEF fees - The USHJA Outreach Program has been established to engage and connect hunter and jumper riders, trainers and horse owners with the USHJA by providing the opportunity to participate in USHJA branded classes and competitions, to earn points toward year-end rewards and awards, and to earn the chance to participate in the prestigious USHJA National Championships. USHJA Outreach Competitions and Classes provide opportunity to earn national recognition in classes from walk/trot to 3'0" in hunter, equitation, and .60m-1.20m in jumper sections at rated and local shows. Any rider may compete in Outreach hunter, jumper, and equitation classes, but riders wishing to earn points and national recognition, must be USHJA free Outreach member or higher. Competitors with a USHJA free Outreach membership or higher will be eligible to earn year-end awards and rewards in hunters, jumpers and equitation. Rewards for competing in any USHJA Outreach Class (Hunter, Equitation, and Jumper) will be based on total points earned. Riders achieving a Bronze, Silver, or Gold point level will be eligible to redeem their points at year-end for items of their choice: USHJA logo wear, Bronze, Silver, or Gold Outreach ribbons or Outreach medallions.

- High point Awards: The highest pointed Gold level rider in each Zone will earn the Golden Back Stage Pass to participate in USHJA National Championship Affiliate Sections, and will be invited to participate in the
- Grand Prix Show Jumping and Hunter Derby course walks, and educational sessions.
- Trainers Awards. Trainers who are USHJA free Outreach members or higher will be awarded points based on their students competing in Outreach classes (student must be a USHJA free Outreach members or higher). One trainer from each Zone whose riders have earned 100 or more points cumulatively, will be recognized as the USHJA Outreach High Point Trainer.
- Horses Awards.
